Why do trees lose their leaves?

Broad leaved, or deciduous, trees lose their leaves in Autumn because they cannot get enough water from cold soil to keep them alive. This year the very dry soil conditions have had the same effect on our trees, so in effect winter has come early.

It is possible that some of the older and younger trees will die, as they have not been able to make enough food to start growing again in the spring.

Trees (and all plants) live by using the energy of sunshine to turn carbon dioxide from the air into a sugar, called glucose, which feeds the tree. This process, called photosynthesis, also needs plenty of water to make it work. Leaves contain special cells which contain a green pigment (colour) called chlorophyll which makes carbon dioxide interact with water and create the sugar. Autumn colours are seen when the green chlorophyll is lost as part of the autumn shutdown, and other pigments which are in the leaves can be seen. Some colours are made as the sugar in the leaf breaks down. Colours are at their most spectacular when this happens slowly and the air cools and we see frost.

This year many leaves have died and turned brown without showing any of these colours, because it has all happened too quickly and the weather has been very warm.



De shed in De Park

During those times, many activities were aimed solely at local people, and the Caribbean and other people often felt excluded and not welcome. As such, the Shed was a place of "safety in numbers" and a very important hub to meet, socialise, and swap stories of journeys and adventures and experiences!

The Shed has been demolished for many years now and a piece of social history has been lost! But the memory lives in our hearts and minds, and we want to share and document those memories.

We also want to hear stories of peoples' journeys and experiences after getting to Newham from the Caribbean, and whether or not they have been to the Shed.

And we will also show how essential and important West Ham Park was for some of our second and third generation Windrush population in the 1960s/1970s and 80s, and even up to the present day.
